Seventh Notice of Public Health Order

“Safer at Home”

FOURTH ADDENDUM

JULY 10, 2020

PURPOSE AND INTENT:

The purpose and intent of this Fourth Addendum is to add clarity to Pitkin County’s existing Seventh Amended Notice of Public Health Order issued May 9, 2020, its first Addendum dated May 27, 2020, its Second Addendum dated June 3, 2020, and its Third Addendum dated June 26, 2020 and to incorporate into the Fourth Addendum certain clarifications in the ability to conduct activities heretofore either prohibited or allowed with restrictions.

ORDER:

The terms of this Fourth Addendum to the Seventh Notice of Public Health Order, its first Addendum dated May 27, 2020, Second Addendum dated June 3, 2020, Third Addendum dated June 26, 2020 and Seventh Amended Notice of Public Health Order issued May 9, 2020 shall remain in effect through **August 10, 2020**. Where the terms of this Addendum conflict with the terms of the Seventh Amended Notice of Public Health Order, its Addendum dated May 27, 2020, and its Second Amendment dated June 3, 2020, and Third Addendum dated June 26, 2020, this Fourth Addendum shall control.

Libraries:

Libraries are hereby permitted to operate at 50% capacity based upon the applicable Fire Code occupancy limit, but occupancy shall not exceed 50 patrons, whichever is less. All libraries must submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using sector-specific guidance to address capacity, physical/social distancing, masks and cleaning practices.

Mandatory Isolation for Individuals:

Individuals experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 shall self-isolate and seek testing immediately by contacting a healthcare provider. If an individual has tested positive for COVID-19 and/or has developed symptoms of COVID-19, including early or mild symptoms (such as cough and shortness of breath), they must isolate (stay away from others) until they have had no fever for at least seventy-two (72) hours (that is three full days of no fever without the use of medicine that reduces fevers), and other symptoms are improving (such as cough or shortness of breath) and at least ten (10) days have passed since symptoms

first appeared. For asymptomatic persons the 10-day minimum isolation shall start from the date that the first positive result is received. This includes people that have tested positive, people awaiting their test results, and people who have symptoms but have not been tested.

Public Health Investigations and Contact Tracing for Individuals:

Individuals shall comply with Pitkin County Public Health case investigation and contact tracing program, including, without limitation, providing names and contact information for other persons that have COVID-19 or were a close contact of someone with COVID-19, or any other information necessary to investigate and control the spread of COVID-19. Failure to reasonably comply with contract tracing may result in criminal or civil sanctions as set forth below.

Individual Compliance with Business or Safety Plans:

Individuals shall adhere to any additional social distance or disease prevention requirements imposed by businesses as a condition of entering their premises or attending gatherings they organize as set forth in the applicable COVID Site Safety Plan submitted to Pitkin County by the business in question by which the business is permitted to operate.

Businesses:

The following businesses or facilities shall remain closed while this Order is in place:

- a. Any business that has been ordered to remain closed by the Seventh Amended Notice of Public Health Order issued May 9, 2020, and its amendments.
- b. Any business or recreational facility that cannot meet the limitations and requirements in this Order including but not limited to as to the number of employees, customers, guests, and attendees; cannot meet the social distancing and disease prevention requirements as set forth in this Order; cannot control the interactions between people to ensure they meet the requirements of this Order; or comply/cooperate with contact tracing as required by Pitkin County Public Health Department.

All businesses shall comply with case and outbreak and all other Public Health investigations, including but not limited to providing names and contact information for employees, customers, or guests that have COVID-19, were a close contact to someone with COVID-19 or otherwise requested by the Pitkin County Public Health Agency to investigate and control the spread of COVID-19. In addition to any other penalties provided under the law, businesses that fail to reasonably comply with contact tracing shall be subject to immediate closure.

Restaurants:

Tables or groups shall be limited to no more than eight people. Tables shall be spaced so that patrons are a minimum of 6 feet apart. Groups shall be spaced in a manner so that no patron from one group is located within 6 feet of a patron from another group. Individuals from one group shall not be permitted to mingle or interact with patrons from another group.

Entertainment Venues:

Performers, lecturers, presenters, or other addressing an assembly of patrons in any music or voice medium must maintain a minimum of 25 feet of distance from the patrons or spectators.

The Pitkin County Public Health Department is tasked with protecting the health and welfare of the residents and visitors of Pitkin County, Colorado by investigating and controlling the causes of epidemic and communicable disease. This Addendum is necessary to control any potential transmission of disease to others. See section 25-1-508, Colorado Revised Statutes. Immediate issuance of this Order is necessary for the preservation of public health, safety, or welfare.

Any person aggrieved and affected by this Addendum or any action taken by Public Health to enforce the Order has the right to request judicial review by filing an action with the Pitkin County District Court within 90 days of the date of this Order, pursuant to section 25-1-515, Colorado Revised Statutes. However, you must continue to obey the terms of this Order while your request for review is pending.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS ADDENDUM IS SUBJECT TO THE PENALTIES CONTAINED IN SECTIONS 25-1-516 AND 18-1.3-501, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES, INCLUDING A FINE OF UP TO FIVE THOUSAND (5,000) DOLLARS AND IMPRISONMENT IN THE COUNTY JAIL FOR UP TO EIGHTEEN MONTHS.
